Dr. Nguyen currently works as the Director of Development and Marketing for **Institute for Civic Education in Vietnam** (www.icevn.org), an US based non-profit organization specialized in civic education and humanity science for the students in Vietnam and worldwide. She is also the Executive Director of Lyceum, a social enterprise specialized in professional and life skills development for success. She has been a community activist and an educator all her life. Her accomplishments include the establishment of the Vietnamese Youth Center of Toronto, Canada; the National Youth Leadership Development Camp “**Len Duong**” for young community activists from across USA and Canada. Dr. Nguyen is currently the Chairwoman of the Board of Directors of Vietnamese Culture and Science Association (www.vcsa.org). In 2012, she was appointed by President Barack Obama to serve on the Board of Vietnam Education Foundation (www.vef.gov), a national foundation established by US government to foster the relationship between United States and Vietnam through education. Until the board term ends in 2016, the foundation helped to train 600+ Ph.D. and Masters’ students in Science and Technology, Mathematics and Environmental Science.

Dr. Nguyen has received numerous awards and recognitions including “**Top 30 Influential Women of Houston**” Award by *D-MAR communication*; and “**Americanism Medal**” by *The Honor Society of Daughters of American Revolution* (DAR) in 2017. She graduated Summa-Cum-Laude with a Bachelor of Science degree (1989) and a Master in Computer Science (1993) from the University of Toronto, Canada. She has over 25 years of experience as IT Portfolio Management professional in both science and health institutions.

Dr Nguyen has a Doctoral Degree in Business Administration from Northcentral University (2015). Her doctoral thesis title was “*Relationship between IT Project Managers’ Emotional Intelligence and their Project Success*”. She is a life-long learner and continues to follow her passion in education through ICEVN and VCSA work.

Dr. Truong Nong is an educator, an adjunct professor, an author, and a community activist. In the past 25 years, Dr. Nong has been involved in community building, working with youth groups as a counselor and leadership trainer. His degrees include a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics, a Master's of Arts in Political Science, and a Ph.D in Education. Being a high school teacher for 14 years and a teacher of Vietnamese studies for the last 5 years, Dr. Nong knows firsthand the impact of education. He has spoken at several conferences on the topic of “Civil Society”, “Vietnam war” and translated 3 books into Vietnamese: “Politics” by *Aristotle*, “Common Sense” by *Thomas Paine*, and “The second treatise of Government” by *John Locke*.

In 1990, he was one of the founders of the **Vietnamese American Youth Organization (VAYO) in Houston, TX**. Currently, he serves as Advisory Board Member of the Vietnamese Culture and Science Association (VCSA), a national Vietnamese American organization based in Houston, Texas. He also served on the first Advisory Board of Sun Flower Missions, a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the lives of people in Vietnam through educational assistance programs.

In 2005, he left his teaching position at Michael DeBakey High School to pursue his dream: to establish the **Institute for Civic Education in Vietnam** (www.icevn.org), a non-profit organization. ICEVN provides on-line educational classes on civic education, business management and leadership development, and aims to build an on-line library of approximately 100 translated books in humanity and social sciences to share the knowledge to the people in Vietnam.

In 2016, he was honored by the **Asian Heritage Society** of San Diego, California with the **Global Outreach Award** for his work with the Institute for Civic Education in Vietnam that reached out to the audience in 140 countries around the globe.

The Institute for Civic Education in Vietnam is a non-profit organization founded in Houston in 2005 with the following objectives: develop the conscience of social responsibility, transparency, and contribute to the future generations of Vietnamese through civic, leadership and business management educational programs. ICEVN's work philosophy is guided by the principles of civic and civil society development, both of which contribute to the foundation of a democratic governance. Three core values animate ICEVN's educational and management actions: Verity, Integrity and Humanity.



To achieve the aforementioned objectives, ICEVN has developed a rich program of online education (e-Learning) with courses on civic education, management, business and leadership. In each course, students are applying the knowledge acquired into a high-feasibility project, as per the model of learner-centered. ICEVN's professors all have at least Masters degrees and the courses are of university undergraduate level.



From 2007 until now, ICEVN has 2039 registered students; over 2.5 millions "hits" per year, over 100 000 "unique readers", and its website visitors are from 140 countries worldwide.

Parallel to the online education mission, ICEVN also translate selected classical works of Western philosophy and political philosophy, economy and law into Vietnamese. These works are published online at www.icevn.org for students and the public, for free consultation. Among the works translated, there are the *Dialogues* by *Plato* (5 books), *Politics* by *Aristotle*, *Ethics* by *Aristotle*, *Social Contract* (*Rousseau*), *Some Thoughts Concerning Education* (*John Locke*) and *Odyssey* (*Homer*).
